Mission Statement

Patrols are assigned by geographic sector, encouraging officers to become intimately associated with neighborhoods and their residents, better enabling them to fight and prevent crime.

Student Police Academy

The LPD hosted a Student Police Academy for students in grades 5 through 8. Due to coronavirus restrictions, only 30 students were allowed to attend each session. The academy ran from August 3rd-14th for students in 7th and 8th grade and August 17th—28th for students in 5th and 6th grade. Students had the opportunity to learn more about law enforcement, participate in drills, receive CPR certification, and attend a K9 Unit demonstration. Graduation ceremonies were held for each graduating class. The ceremonies were recorded and posted on social media for parents and guardians to watch. National Night Out

National Night Out is an annual Crime Prevention and Safety event that celebrates community partnerships. In past years, the LPD would participate in events around the city to meet with community organizations and residents. This event is typically held on the first Tuesday in August, but due to the pandemic it was rescheduled to October 6, 2020. In order to celebrate National Night Out, the LPD joined several community partners and neighborhood groups in a car parade around the city.



Grants

The Lowell Police Department was awarded the **FY 2020 Reducing Injury and Death of Missing Individuals with Dementia and Developmental Disabilities Program** grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance. Funding will be used to implement a Project Lifesaver program in the City of Lowell.

The LPD also received the **FY 2020 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)** and the **Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program** grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance. The JAG grant supports civilian staff members in the LPD. The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program grant will help the Department respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The LPD will purchase PPE (N95 respirators, gloves, disposable coveralls, etc....) for officers to use in the event that they come into contact with an individual showing symptoms of coronavirus. The Department will also purchase cleaning supplies to disinfect the precincts on a regular basis.
