Throughout the month of November, LPD officers participated in the No Shave November campaign. During the campaign, police officers that make a donation to a charity are allowed to grow facial hair for the month of November. This year the department decided to donate to two charities: Lowell General Hospital Team*Walk* and Angel Flight NE. The LPD selected Lowell General Hospital Team*Walk* two years ago for its No Shave November campaign in order to raise funds to support local cancer patients. This year the department was able to raise \$4,400 for cancer patients. The LPD also selected Angel Flight NE in honor of Elizabeth Barnes from the Middlesex District Attorney's Office. Elizabeth Barnes was tragically killed in a plane crash on October 2nd, 2020. Funds for Angel Flight NE will support flight transportation for those in need of emergency medical care.
