

Mission Statement



Lowell Police Academy Graduation

36 recruits graduated from the Lowell Police Academy (LPA) on October 10th, 2024. The LPA provides instruction to recruits in subjects including but not limited to constitutional law, criminal law, criminal investigations, firearms, defense tactics, and emergency vehicle operation. Recruits that successfully graduate from the academy go on to serve several cities and towns throughout the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In 2024, graduates from the Lowell Police Academy joined the Bedford, Boxborough, Brookline, Chelmsford, Fitchburg, Littleton, Marblehead, Natick, Newton, Revere, Wakefield, and Westford police departments. The LPD welcomed 12 officers from the academy: J. Hor, P. Morrow, C. DeRosa, L. Morris, C. Musangu, E. Hernandez, K. Torres, D. DeJesus, J. Arroyo, D. Durham, C. Robertson, and D. Dougal.





LGBTQ+ Liaison

In the fall of 2024, Lt. Dawn Beauchesne was appointed to be the Lowell Police Department's LGBTQ+ Liaison. The LGBTQ+ Liaison acts as the point of contact between the department and LGBTQ+ community, assists with police services, and provides resources to the community. Additionally, the LGBTQ+ Liaison is responsible for overseeing the department's Safe Place Initiative. The Safe Place Initiative is a free program open to businesses throughout the city. Businesses enrolled in the program commit to assisting victims of hate crimes by providing a safe place for victims to call the police and allowing them to remain on the premise until police arrive. 


LPD Research Evaluation Program

The LPD is in the process of conducting an evaluation on the department's response to victims of certain crimes. As a result, some victims may receive a business card from an officer advising them that they will receive a brief survey, via text. The card reads as follows: "The Lowell Police Department is working with a researcher to help evaluate our response to victims of crime. Over the next couple of weeks, you will receive a text message asking you to complete a short 3-minute survey. Please let the officer know if you are not interested in receiving this text message. Please note that text messages received regarding the survey are legitimate and individuals will not be asked to pay to complete the survey.
